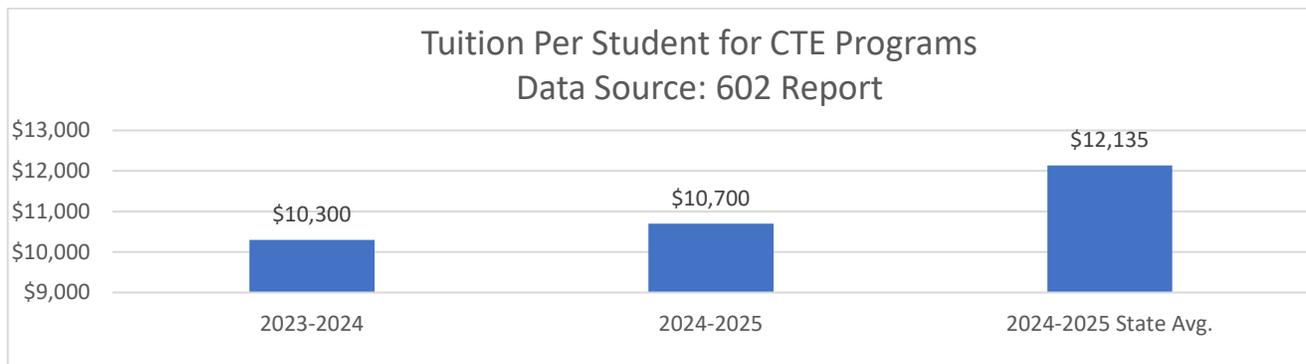

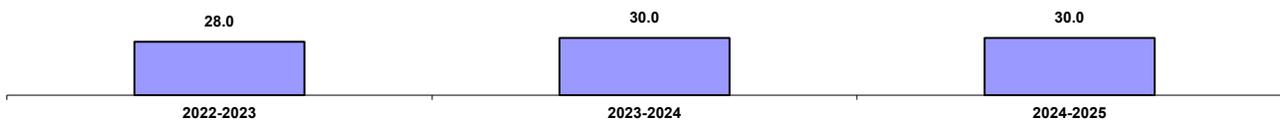

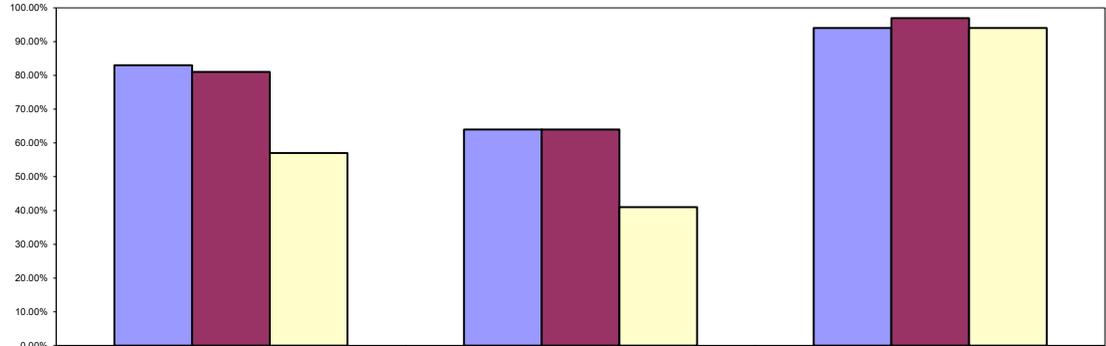
***Number Enrolled in CTE Programs as a Percent of all Juniors and Seniors in Component District High Schools**

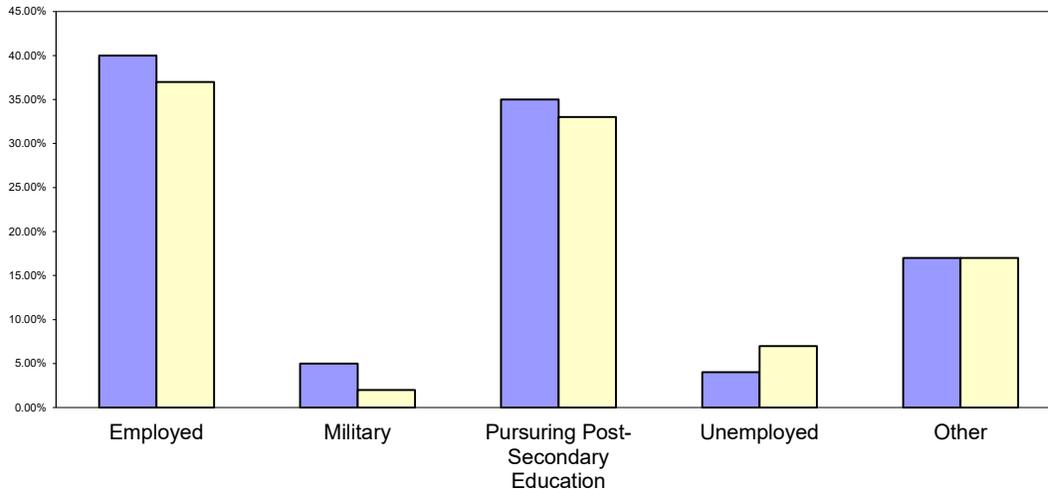
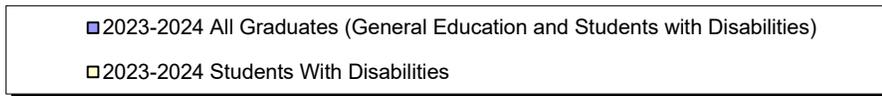

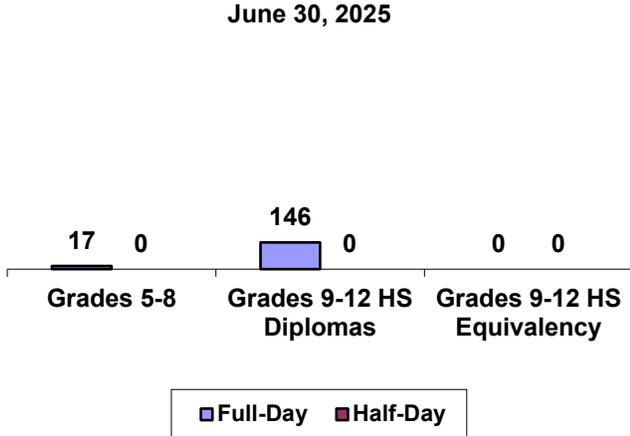

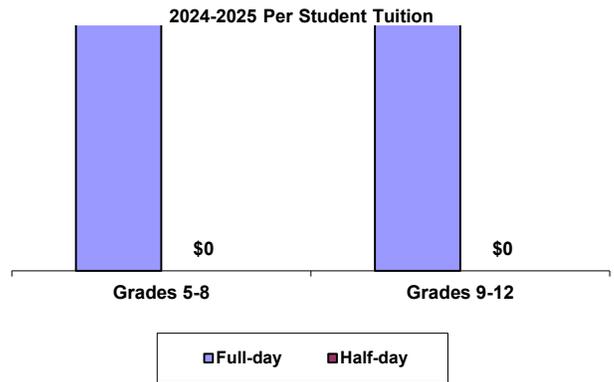
Alternative Education

Adult Basic Education

Based on data reported for the National Reporting System (NRS) for adult education programs, enrollment in adult basic education programs for 2024-25 was 107.

Educational Gain

Under the NRS, educational gain is the primary goal for students in adult beginning/intermediate programs, adult secondary (low) programs, and in English for speakers of other languages programs. Students are counted as achieving educational gain if they exceed established reference points in their standardized test scores between enrollment and re-testing.

Special Education Enrollment and Tuition

- ❖ 12 students per teacher plus one paraprofessional (12:1:1)
- ❖ 6 students per teacher plus one paraprofessional (6:1:1)
- ❖ 12 students per teacher plus four paraprofessionals (12:1+1:3)
- ❖ 8 students per teacher plus 1 paraprofessional (8:1:1)
- ❖ 15 students per teacher plus 1 paraprofessional (15:1:1)
- ❖ 6 students per teacher plus 2.5 paraprofessional (6:1:2.5)

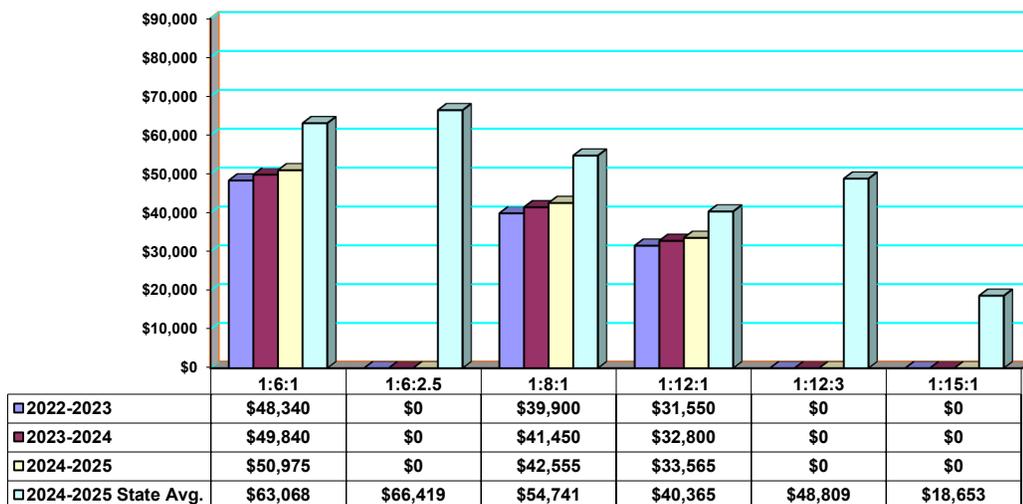
